#### Billie Perryman's Banana Pudding Elvis Style

(Billie Perryman is the wife of radio disc jockey, Tom Perryman, who knew Elvis. Elvis visited in their home while performing in East Texas during the 1950's.)

3/4 Cup Sugar
2 Tbs. Flour
1/4 tsp. salt
2 Cups Milk
4 Eggs
1 tsp. vanilla
Nabisco Vanilla Wafers
Sliced bananas (she used a lot of bananas because
Elvis loved them)

Prepare first five ingredients in a double boiler. Cook, stirring constantly, until thickened (about 10-12 minutes). Line a large bowl with a layer of wafers and sliced bananas. Pour in pudding. Repeat layers until all is used. Top pudding mixture with vanilla wafers. Refrigerate and serve when cooled.

#### **Crescent Sopapilla Cheesecake**

2 (8 oz) cans crescent rolls
2 (8 oz) packages cream cheese
1 cup sugar
1 tsp vanilla extract (or almond extract)
1/2 cup melted butter or margarine (one stick)
1/2 cup cinnamon sugar (1/2 C sugar & 1 tsp cinnamon)

Using 9x13 baking pan, unroll one package of refrigerated crescent rolls and line the bottom of the pan. Flatten rolls and press edges together to seal.

Mix the cream cheese, sugar, and extract. Spread over the crescent rolls in pan.

Unroll the other can of crescent rolls and place on top of cream cheese mixture.

Pour one stick of melted butter or margarine over the top and sprinkle with about 1/2 cup of the cinnamon sugar mixture. Bake at 350 for 30 minutes.

#### **Southwestern Crescent Snacks**

1 can crescent rolls
2 teaspoons prepared mustard
1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper
1/4 cup finely chopped onion
1 cup finely chopped ham1 cup shredded Cheddar or
Monterey Jack cheese

Heat oven to 375. Unroll dough into 2 long rectangles. Place rectangles in ungreased 13x9 inch pan; press over bottom and 1/4 inch up sides to form crust. Firmly press perforations to seal.

In small bowl, combine ham and mustard. Spoon over dough; spread gently to distribute evenly. Sprinkle with remaining ingredients. Bake for 18-20minutes or until golden brown. Cut into 2 or 3 inch squares and then cut diagonally to form triangles. Makes 24.

#### **Slow Cooker Scrabble**

2 cups wheat chex

2 cups corn chex

2 cups rice chex

3 cups thin pretzel sticks

1 13 ounce can or jar of salted peanuts or asst. mixed nuts

1 teaspoon garlic salt

1 teaspoon celery salt

1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt

2 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese

1/3 cup melted butter

1/3 cup Worcestershire sauce

In large clean (double) paper bag, mix together pretzels, cereals, and nuts along with the garlic salt, celery salt, seasoned salt, and grated cheese. Empty bag mixture into a large mixing bowl and sprinkle the melted butter and Worcestershire sauce over all mixing gently with hands.

Empty bowl into slow cooker and cook on low for 3 to 4 hours.

Tear open paper bags you used to originally mix the scrabble and spread them out onto a counter. Spread hot snack mixture onto torn open bags and let dry for a minimum of one hour letting the paper absorb any excess moisture.

Store in airtight containers. Keeps for several weeks without going stale.

#### MicroPulse Systems Monitor by John Sharpe

John Sharpe installed a MicroPulse Systems Monitor system in his GMC. He made a presentation for the Classics about this system at our October rally. He has also made a similar presentation at the GMCI rally in Colorado. I will try to address the highlights of his presentation. This system monitors tank liquid levels, LP gas level, battery charge, and provides a lighted water pump switch. The system uses pressure sensors to measure liquid levels. No floats, probes, strips, or holes are required and will work with any type of tank material.

The LP monitor uses the original LP tank sensor. Measured levels are in 1/8ths and displayed on a tri-colored LED graph.

The parts that John uses included the Monitor Panel (about \$125), sensors with Teflon tape sealant, wiring, fresh water ¾" PVC T, fittings, and clamps, black water 1/8" brass nipple, epoxy putty, and ¾' PVC cap. John warns that although the sensors have RJ11 jacks (telephone line); telephone cables may not be compatible with this system.

#### **Install Black Water Sensor**

There are different types of sensors. One requires drilling a hole in the bottom of the tank. John opted to use another type which is threaded into 34" NPT. He mounted the sensor in the gate valve between the gate valve and the holding tank. I didn't even know there was a space there. The simplified version of his creativity is that he drilled and tapped an 18" brass nipple into the gate valve and reinforced the nipple with epoxy putty. He then drilled and tapped a 34" PVC cap for the other end of the nipple. The sensor screws into the PVC cap. Next he attached the wire cable to the RJ11 jack and put a protective boot over it. Ask John about the bloody details, as it wasn't that easy. He didn't mention that you might want to drain the tank first.






- · Install plug into sensor & slide protective boot in place
- . Tie wrap wires and route them too the panel location

#### **Tech Notes**

#### **Install Fresh Water Sensor**

The fresh water tank sensor was easier. He cut the water hose between the tank and the water pump (as close to the tank as possible) and, using a ¾" PVC T, barb adapters, and hose clamps, mounted the sensor. Although not necessary, he removed the old float and covered the original float hole.



#### **Mount Panel**

Select a location for the panel and cut the hole. John put his by the refrigerator. Be careful of what may be behind the wall when you cut the hole.

#### **Locate Panel**


- Located on the wall next to refrigerator because of it's

- · central location

#### Wiring

The wiring is straightforward; power, ground, water pump, LP tank, and the two RJ11 cables from the black water and the fresh water tanks.

#### Wiring



#### **Calibrate**

Calibrate the system according to the manufacture's instructions.

Most of our GMC tank sensors have rusted out and haven't worked in years and this system is a good inexpensive replacement/upgrade.

We may now need to expand our technical discussions to blocks of wood. If you want some real good speed tips, go find a 10-year-old Cub Scout and his dad. The second best is to search the web. You will

find all sorts of items designed to separate you from your money. The local Boy Scout Office or hobby shops may have tools, how-to books, and wheels (make sure that you get the P347 wheels and axels).

James Deese (Edmond, OK) has been visiting us and is sharing speed tips that took his son to regional competition 40 years ago. If these work, Dolly (Joyce Murdock) had better move over.

Here are some things to consider:

- Bake your block of wood. Bake at 200-225 for 2 hours. My blocks lost 1 to 2 oz. of moister each.
- Pay special attention to wheel alignment, vibration, and imperfections. True, round, and polish the wheels.
- The heavier the better. The balance point (CG) should be 1 to 1 ½ inches in front of the rear axel or about at the middle axel.
- The fewer wheels on the track the better. Cub Scouts have best results with 3 wheel cars. Look it up.

#### **Computer Tip**

I just got a new a new laptop with Windows 7. It's always a joy to learn a new operating environment but I'm coping. I'm not sure if Windows 7 was ready for release, as I am getting as many as 20 updates per day. I had a minor problem and spent an hour on the phone to India. The tech reminded me of an executable program that we used years ago which may be of help to you all. You know all of that junk that shows up on the task bar (lower right part of the screen) that you don't know how to get rid of. That stuff slows down the boot process. A lot of those processes are started at boot time to speed up the start of programs that you may or may not use later. . The start of those processes is controlled by a program called msconfig.exe. To run it, search for msconfig.exe or run it in the Start-Run window (Windows XP). When the utility comes up, then select the Startup tab. My tech in India had me Disable All and most of the junk on the task bar disappeared after the next boot.
