

THE FIRE

To start...we bought this coach in 2004 and in these 6 years we have never had a short, a flicker, no power, or any reason to think that we had a problem.

We arrived on Wednesday afternoon and shared beef stew and cabbage and sausage in the coach with the **Harpers and Reeves**. (FYI ...Even the wonderful aroma of leftover boiled cabbage will **not** remove the smell of smoke) The next morning we get up, clean up, straighten up and are at the club house about 8:00 a.m. Having coffee and all excited to start the rally. We had been there about 20 minutes when someone asked if we had brought any hats. Yes we had and **Bruce** left to go get them.

Walking to the coach, he sees the smoke but had no thoughts of a coach fire. When he turns the curve in the road, **Jerry Reeves** starts yelling "Hurry, Hurry your coach is on fire." **Jerry** is frantic and exhausted. He thought I was still on the inside and was beating on the window with a big fire extinguisher. They didn't get the window to break until the cold water hit it. After **Bruce** got there with the key and opened the door, he and **Jerry** were able to put the fire out.

If our door had not been locked the damage would have been minimal and, in the grand scheme of things, it was minimal. We were not in the coach, no one was hurt or possibly killed, no other coaches were involved and again, we get to see the goodness of our people. The overhead cabinets on passenger side were burned, fell onto the beds and burned them. My co-pilot chair was burned, the carpet was burned in places, the wall on that side was burned, the ceiling was destroyed plus all the foam insulation under ceiling was smoked to the frame. When the firemen came in they ruined the cap at front of coach and they use a lot of water....Bruce is still mad about that cap.

All the window tint across from the fire is bubbled and, because of the smoke and heat, all of it will have to be replaced. The air conditioner and air vent covers are melted. **Smoke.....The smoke damage** is everywhere. Unbelievable... **Frances Reeves** had her camera and put some pretty good pictures on the net. What I noticed about the pictures was how many fire extinguisher there were on the scene. We are prepared, but if you can't get to the fire because of locked doors ... well...Some people who had pets with them went to unlock their doors. These are thoughts about this for the future,

It was an electrical fire. At some point in time a 110 wire had been rerouted.. We are bouncing up and down going down the road all the time and things jar loose.....if you know you have done something in your coach, maybe you should check it out.

We start the calls to the insurance company to get the coach home. In the mean time, the park transferred our space rental to a cabin and allowed our coach to stay on site. If you can imagine the debris, the water soaked, the smoke smell, the total mess inside you know how much we appreciate everyone. I just have to mention some of the men: **Boyd Mooney, Jerry Reeves, Billy Massey, Chip Chebuhar, and James Harper.** There were others, but these guys shoveled out and hauled off this mess helping to get it ready to drive home. It was very weird thing to see was a big

sheet of plywood (on a **motorcoach**) covering the window opening so you can go down the road ... remember ... it is raining.

The insurance ... well to get a claims adjuster, they could not get to it until at least the next Tuesday and this was only Thursday. Bruce finally got to try to start the engine.....everything is good, no damage anywhere except inside the coach! I notified the insurance company that we were taking it home and they agreed This was about the 4th time I had talked to the lady who was in charge of our claim. After a bad start, we get to know each other a little better. I did make her understand this was not just a 35 year old motor coach, but was a classic antique!! She said she would research this before we talked again when we got back to Fort Worth. We are with State Farm and in 2007 I called and put a stated value on this 1973 motorcoach. State Farm doesn't do a per say stated value, but my agent had told me to keep all receipts. Bruce had them all...he does nearly all the work on the coach, so something you would take to mechanic and maybe pay \$700 one ticketBruce has individual receipts for \$400, every gasket or what ever was purchased to do the job, no labor charge. He probably overwhelmed them.....but that is OK. They tried to total it but we said no, we want the coach! Bruce knows all the work that has gone into it. We feel like they treated us fair.

The work begins! I know the first 6 weeks were spent on gutting, cleaning and washing with degreaser everything in that place. I know more about a GMC than I ever wanted to know. We had to go all the way to the frame in the front, so not only do we get new carpet and the obvious walls and ceiling, but we have new insulation ... isn't that exciting. The work is staggering, but we like our coach! What the fire and smoke didn't get, the water did. Bruce has been concentrating on getting the motor good and making sure it that when it takes us somewhere it would also bring us home. We had finally reached the point where we were thinking about changing some things and maybe redoing the inside. A I was telling this to my neighbor she looks at the gutted inside and remarked, "You were looking for maybe a new dress or bright shade of lipstick but had to have a whole face lift!" We have to laugh sometimes!

Bruce has had so many people to offer to help, but there's no room for more than two at a time in there. Most of the time it was our son or me helping Bruce. **Warren Mitchell and Jerry Reeves** helped out with windows and walls.

A big **Thank you** to all who offered help, tools, advice, support.....and the trip to **Joe Pool Lake** for our luncheon was awesome and a much needed break. The work has began to speed up as we get closer to the end. And that is scary.....What will we do every day ???? We are looking forward to it!
