TECH SESSION

The tech session was a discussion on causes for engine overheating that you don't often think about.

I brought a distributor with me and demonstrated parts that would stick, causing the timing to be off at different RPM's which would cause over heating.

We discussed fan clutch and I pointed out the spring on the front that Hayden admits is set at a lower temperature than OEM. If you use a 195 degree thermostat it would cause the fan to cycle in and out often.

We also discussed water pumps and thermostat and their part in engine overheating.
