

The rally had a great turnout, we had quite a few visitors and newer members, or members from other clubs. There were also a couple of elite members to show up. An open forum tech session was held at the winter rally and members were asked to tell the group the solution to a recent GMC problem or if they are currently experiencing a problem, perhaps someone would have an answer to solving that problem.

The first subject concerned cracked intake manifolds. A letter to the editor of the July 2015 STREET RODDER magazine was read. The questioner had a Tornado engine in his car. The cause of the intake crack below the carburetor is believed to be caused by extended wide open throttle driving (probably long uphill climbs in a GMC) with hot exhaust gas passing below the carburetor. If the crossover passage is blocked then the cause of the cracking is eliminated.

The magazine told of "Special Exhaust Plugs" by Ebelbrock Part Number P/N2733. Edelbrock suggests drilling a 1/4 or 5/16 inch hole through each plug. A member told of one case where these plugs rattled in the heads and almost ruined them. A plate at the gasket would keep the plugs in place. Dick Patterson offers intake gaskets with a stainless plate that goes between the gasket and the head to block the crossover. Another member told us that Felpro Performance Gaskets are available with no cutout for the crossover.

Next, a poster was shown of the carburetor input fuel filter. It was suggested that the spring and check valve (plastic bean) be removed before installing the filter. Sometimes the gasoline with ethanol in it causes the check valve bean to adhere to the rubber gasket on the filter which restricts or blocks fuel flow. Several members reported that they have eliminated this filter and added an inline or canister fuel filter between the fuel pump and the carburetor. We were reminded that if an electric fuel pump is in your coach that it should be wired through the oil pressure switch so that if the engine dies that the electric pump will turn off. The GMC maintenance manual says that the fuel filter should be changed at 12,000 mile or 12 month time intervals.

We then talked about fan belts of the automotive and industrial type. Industrial belts are available at Grainger and are 1/64 of an inch wider than automotive belts. The belt being wider will cause it to ride higher on the pulley. The "A" industrial belt compares to the "4L" automotive belts. Automotive belts lengths are measured on the outside of the belt and industrial belts are measured on the inside, thus similar length belts have different lengths to be of equal circumference. GMC belts of similar size are:

	Automotive	Industrial
Alternator Belt	15570	A56
*Power Steering	15450	A44
Air Conditioner (455)	15620	A61
Air Conditioner (403)	15600	A59

* It was mentioned that a one inch longer power steering bolt moves the pump out slightly making it easier to remove the cap to check the fluid level. If you do this then use 15460 or A45 belt. Industrial belts cost about \$10.00 more than an automotive belt.

One member told the group that Gates makes fleet quality belts that are made to closer tolerances and have a longer life than regular automotive belts. The fleet belts are available at O'Reilly's under the normal automotive part number followed by HD. Some Gates fleet belts are called "Fleet Runner" belts.

The next question was about which rear air bag system our group prefers. Currently people are using the OEM Firestone bag, the Firestone bag with lifters, sully bag, mono bag, quadra bag or four bag. The general agreement was no recommendation as each owner has his own requirements such as maximum-minimum raise and lowering, soft ride, new equipment, and or availability of replacement parts. Cinnabar was named as a source for the original bag at \$450.00. Applied also list them in their catalog.

A question was asked about transmission fluid leaks around the rear chain housing. A member stated that his experience with aluminum transmission housings that normally bolt holes are blind so that this leak would not be from inside the transmission following the bolt threads but probably fan the gasket to the bolt hole. He stated that there are aluminum washers available that, have an o ring bonded to the washer. Those washers should be available at your local performance automotive supply store or by the brand name STAT-0-SEAL from Speedway motors, Lincoln, Nebraska, phone number (800) 979-0122. Speedway Motors also has the Lucas Oil Slick Mist Water based polishes that a sample was given to attendees at the fall Gladewater rally. The product should be available at your local auto parts store if they carry Lucas Oil Products. Speedway offered a Slick Mist Detail Kit that includes 3 hand pump spray bottles, one each of interior, exterior, and tire shine.

The final subject was related to the question of what amp-hours rated batteries one should purchase for house batteries. It was first pointed out not to confuse amp-hours with cold cranking amps. Additionally we were reminded that battery types should not be mixed, if you have two house batteries, and that if you have two, they should be replaced in pairs so as not to have an older or weaker battery equalizing with the stronger one. Amp hour rating for a battery is for a 20 hour time period. For example, if you fuse a 3 amp appliance then you need a 60 amp hour rated battery. (3 amp times 20 hours = 60 amp hours)


There are charts available that list the amp usage of the various electrical items found in a GMC. Several members have chosen to use six (6) volt golf cart batteries rather than parallel twelve (12) volt deep cycle batteries. One golf cart battery has 208 amp hours and a group 29 deep cycle 12 volt battery has 125 amp hours. From this you can see the advantage of the use of six (6) volt batteries.

During the battery discussion it was brought to our attention that 12 volt blankets and mattress pad heaters are available on Amazon.com and at Cabella's Sporting Good Stores.

Worth mentioning is that one member who has had several different rv's found that most overlooked water leak source is the roof a/c units The a/c can vibrate loose and leak and the problem can be solved by removing the lower unit cover and tightening the "J" bolt nuts; Do not over tighten so that the roof gasket is not damaged.

Scott Nutter announced that he has available to loan out a torsion bar pork chop unloader tool that is used when adjusting front ride height
